Speaker Prof. Daniel Roehr

Vita Daniel Roehr is Associate Professor of Landscape Architecture at the University of British Columbia and a licenced landscape architect in British Columbia and Germany. Daniel teaches studio, site engineering, advanced representation, living roof seminars, and studies abroad in the School of Architecture and Landscape Architecture. Since 2007, he runs the research group greenskins lab at UBC. His current research focuses on the integration of living roofs as part of the holistic system for storm water management. Daniel and his team conduct expertise studies and consult professionally in North America and Europe. In 2013-14 he was a UBC Sustainability Research Fellow and was selected as a member in one of six teams to compete designing the Canadian National Holocaust Memorial in Ottawa. In 2016 he received the Killam Teaching Prize from UBC. He co-authored the book “Living Roofs in Integrated Urban Water Systems”, (Routledge 2015) and regularly publishes in scientific journals and professional magazines such as TOPOS, Garten + Landschaft, Neue Landschaft and Landscape Design. Daniel has practiced in Europe, North America, and Asia. From 1995 to 2000, he was project architect of the award-winning Daimler-Chrysler Green Roof Project, Potsdamer Platz, Berlin, Germany. Before moving to Vancouver, he ran his own firm in Berlin from 1999 to 2007, and co-founded a firm in Shanghai in 2004.
